



Additional Information and Resources in Contra Costa County

The Contra Costa Clean Water Program provides information and resources about used oil recycling throughout the County through its “Mr. Funnelhead” program. The website is www.funnelhead.com. There are phone numbers and web links at this site for each city in the County and to waste management companies.

The County’s recycling website www.cccrecycle.org has detailed information about materials accepted at curbside in each city, and other recycling information. The County’s recycling hotline 800-750-4096 provides information on household hazardous waste as well as general recycling questions.

Curbside pickup of used oil and filters is available in most cities in the County including:

(Note that curbside service is not available to residents of multifamily housing with dumpster service.) Residents who do not have curbside service may take used oil to any of the collection centers listed on the last page of the student lesson book.

There are three household hazardous waste facilities in the County. Each serves residents of its region of the County and requires proof of residency. The websites noted next to each one are for the waste management agencies serving each region, and each of these have operating hours and materials accepted. Each site has useful information as well on a wide range of recycling and other environmental topics.
